## OVERVIEW

Steeped in London's history and a destination in itself, The Dorchester is in the heart of Mayfair, with many of its elegant rooms and suites overlooking leafy Hyde Park. Suites include a selection of one-of-a-kind signature suites, favoured for their history, beauty and celebrity intrigue.

Some of London's best restaurants include The Grill by Tom Booton for modern British dining, along with three Michelin-starred Alain Ducasse at The Dorchester and iconic Cantonese favourite China Tang at The Dorchester.

For afternoon tea, The Promenade is a British institution at the heart of the hotel, serving the pastry team's famous fluffy scones, seasonal cakes and pastries. After dinner, Vesper Bar beckons with its master mixologists shaking up signature cocktails behind the bar.

## HISTORY

The Dorchester's story is one which began in 1931 and continues to unfold today, as every guest makes their mark on the hotel's ever-evolving legacy.

The Dorchester has lived many lives since the original house was bought in 1792 by Joseph Damer, the Earl of Dorchester. In 1910 it became the American Embassy, and during World War I it was used as a hospital. In fact, it wasn't until 1931 that Sir Robert McAlpine first created a vision for the 'perfect hotel'. His state-of-the-art design was built in record time over 18 months, at the speed of a floor a week, to become the world's first hotel to be constructed from reinforced concrete.

Since this grand opening, the hotel has played host to some of the world's biggest events, from royal state banquets to legendary parties, and continues to redefine the luxury British hotel experience.

## DÉCOR

Within months of its opening in 1931, The Dorchester's sumptuous décor and unrivalled standards of personal service established its reputation as one of the world's greatest hotels. Over the decades, it's attracted the design pioneers and leading architects of their time, who have each left their mark on the hotel's legacy.

Among many unique features, look out for Bruno Moïnard's gleaming golden design of The Grill and Oliver Messel's flamboyant interiors in the Oliver Messel suite and The Penthouse and Pavilion.

## GUEST SERVICES

The hotel's warm and experienced team is on hand to take care of you from the moment you arrive, from the friendly green-coated doormen to the knowledgeable concierge, who are truly the 'keepers of the keys' when it comes to this fine city. Once settled in, guests can enjoy services including daily newspapers, laundry and dry-cleaning, shoe shining and car services, along with an optional personal butler for suites.

Near to The Promenade, designer florist Philip Hammond and his team welcome you to their world with a boutique and workshop. Inside, they reveal beautiful bouquets and candles, as well as the hotel's latest pride and joy: The Dorchester Rose.
