One day itinerary: **Children**

Milan may be famous for its football, fashion and food, but there's a lot more to discover, inspire and entertain in this great city, especially for families. From museums with children's exhibits and parks with playgrounds to captivating castles and cathedrals, follow this one-day itinerary when travelling with children to make the most of your family holiday in Milan.

Start the day with a 25-minute stroll or a 20-minute drive to the Duomo di Milano.



DUOMO DI MILANO

The striking Duomo di Milano is an extraordinary Gothic cathedral that took centuries to build and currently attracts thousands of visitors each year. Take the kids right up to the top, where a rooftop terrace offers panoramic views of the city. The climb is exciting in itself as visitors walk up spiralling turrets, witnessing incredible architecture along the way.

Next, take a three-minute walk across Piazza del Duomo to World of Leonardo da Vinci in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II.



THE WORLD OF LEONARDO EXHIBITION, LEONARDO3 MUSEUM

Visit The World of Leonardo Exhibition from travelling museum Leonardo3, wholly dedicated to exploring the designs and work of artist and inventor Leonardo da Vinci. Bring the children's school studies to life in this interactive museum, which reveals da Vinci's impressive diversity of creations, housing working models of machines he designed, reconstructions of his musical instruments and 3D restorations of his paintings and drawings.

Then, take a 15-minute walk or drive to Sforza Castle.



SFORZA CASTLE (CASTELLO SFORZESCO)

Instantly recognisable by its vibrant red brick exterior, Sforza Castle is a 15th century fortress built on the site of even older fortifications. While its exterior is impressive in itself, inside are several fascinating museums for all the family. A whole range of artefacts and artworks are on display, including Michelangelo's final work, an unfinished marble sculpture of Christ and the Virgin Mary entitled 'Pietà Rondanini'.

Leave the castle and explore the grounds surrounding it.



PARCO SEMPIONE

A 19th century English garden next to Sforza Castle, the huge Parco Sempione is one of the most popular green spaces in the city. The perfect place for a leisurely stroll or a delicious Milanese picnic, the park features manicured lawns and a picturesque lake. Another highlight is the Civic Aquarium of Milan, the third-oldest aquarium in Europe, which is home to hundreds of different species of sea life.

The next destination can be reached with a 20-minute walk or a five-minute drive.



MUSEUM OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

The largest dedicated science and technology museum in Italy, this institution offers family-friendly attractions such as a 'science for young people' zone and interactive exhibits like the real Toti submarine, which is open to children to explore. The museum also houses an expansive collection of Leonardo di Vinco inventions, as well as other exhibitions dedicated to jewellery, science, transport and space.

To return to the hotel, it's a 20-minute drive from the Museum of Science and Technology.
