One day itinerary: **Nearby**

A beautiful and bustling hub of fashion, football and art, Milan is a city that is constantly on the go. Aside from its spectacular architecture and world-famous shopping, Milan, as with the rest of Italy, is beloved for its food and drink culture – something to embrace and indulge in during your visit. For guests at the elegant Hotel Principe di Savoia, the best city sights, shopping, and culture are all within easy reach with this one-day itinerary.

Begin your day in Milan with a visit to the Piazza Gae Aulenti, a 10-minute walk away from the hotel.



PIAZZA GAE AULENTI

20124 Milan

A bold, modern plaza in the centre of Milan, the Piazza Gae Aulenti has become a local favourite since its unveiling in 2012. The focal point of this pristine public square is a contemporary fountain surrounded by bustling cafés, restaurants and shops, and makes for a particularly delightful area to stop and sip a cappuccino amongst the Milanese on a Sunday.

Then take a five-minute walk from the piazza to 10 Corso Como.

Located in a picturesque and verdant courtyard, 10 Corso Como's chic open-air patio is the perfect place for a coffee or cocktail, but that's just the first of many assets at this multifunctional, beautifully designed space. At once an art gallery, restaurant, bookshop and fashion and lifestyle concept store, 10 Corso Como offers boutique shopping and dining in a relaxed and stylish setting.

From 10 Corso Como, Eataly is a three-minute walk away.



EATALY MILAN SMERALDO

Located in the beautiful space that once housed the legendary Teatro Smeraldo, Eataly is Milan's favourite food store; overflowing with fresh, delicious produce, from barrels of vegetables and freshly baked artisanal bread to prime beef and rare truffles. If you fancy stopping for a meal, there are numerous eateries in-store, as well as the Michelin-starred restaurant, Alice, on the first floor.

Next, take a 15-minute walk to get to the Brera district.



BRERA

20121 Milan

A short walk north from the busier tourist areas of the city, Brera is an arty, bohemian district made up of winding streets, ice cream shops and boutiques, and decorated with colourful hanging baskets. Milan can be a fast-paced city, so take some time to wander down the Brera alleys and enjoy a relaxed stroll along the cobbles of this fashionable and historic quarter.

Bar Martini is a 15-minute walk from Brera.



BAR MARTINI

A collaboration between Dolce & Gabbana and Martini, Bar Martini, with its entirely black and red interior, is a stylish concept bar and restaurant, complete with patio and garden room. Popular with Milan's stylish set and found in the centre of the city, do as the Milanese do and come for an aperitivo before an evening out, or making dining here the main event.

To get back to the hotel from Bar Martini, walk for 20 minutes or take a five-minute taxi ride.
