## One day itinerary: **Children**

A major cultural capital, Paris offers myriad opportunities for family-friendly holidays. The museums are full of children's exhibitions, historic parks are modernised with activities for youngsters, and iconic attractions are designed to appeal to the whole family. Follow this one-day itinerary to make the most out of your trip to Paris and discover the City of Light through the starry eyes of your children.

*Begin the day with a 10-minute walk from the hotel to Place de la Concorde.*



### PLACE DE LA CONCORDE

*75008 Paris*

An iconic public square with a chequered past, Place de la Concorde is home to the impressive Luxor Obelisk and the world's largest moving Ferris wheel. The wheel opens between November and May each year, and as well as being a fun experience for all the family, offers panoramic views over the city and key sights such as the Champs-Élysées, and the Eiffel Tower.

*Next, visit Jardin des Tuileries, just five minutes' walk from Place de Concorde.*



### JARDIN DES TUILERIES

Open to the people of Paris since the days of the French Revolution, Jardin des Tuileries is one of the oldest public parks in the city. Nestled between the impressive Louvre museum and Place de la Concorde, the riverside garden is a slice of tranquillity in the bustling city, with plenty of space for children to run around.

*Stroll through Jardin des Tuileries to the Louvre on the other side.*



### MUSÉE DU LOUVRE

The Louvre is one of the most famous and distinctive museums in Paris. Instantly recognisable by the pyramid that stands in the courtyard, the complex is an essential stop for art enthusiasts of all ages. For children, there's a special treasure hunt activity called THATLou (the original offering from the Treasure Hunt at the Museum team), which takes them on a journey through the Louvre, solving clues to uncover artistic treasures.

*Then, take a 20-minute walk or a 10-minute drive to Grévin Paris.*



## GRÉVIN PARIS

A favourite among youngsters since it opened in 1882, Grévin Paris is home to several hundred lifelike waxworks of famous people throughout history, from French leader Napoleon to footballer Cristiano Ronaldo. Visit the 'Children's World' to discover wax models of characters from books, cartoons and children's films, and take the interactive Discovery Tour to discover the secrets behind the waxworks.

*From Grévin Paris, Montmartre is a 15-minute drive away.*



## MONTMARTRE

*75018 Paris*

Visitors who make the steep climb to the Sacré Cœur, the three-domed church at the crest of Montmartre hill, will be rewarded with spectacular vistas of Paris stretched out below. Afterwards, give the family's feet a rest and catch the miniature train (Le Petit Train de Montmartre) for a guided tour of colourful Montmartre that will keep the kids entertained. The cobbled streets are packed with shops, small galleries and plenty of vibrant bistros for an authentic Parisian dinner.

*Hail a taxi for a 20-minute drive back to the hotel.*
