One day itinerary: **Nearby**

One of the world's great metropolises, Paris offers up modern thrills alongside an inimitable sense of occasion that captivated literary greats like Hemingway, Wilde and untold others. Across its 20 arrondissements, visitors will find an abundance of art, food, and culture. With this one-day itinerary, guests of Le Meurice are within easy reach of the city's most storied salons, museums and boutiques.

Start the day with some shopping along Rue du Faubourg Saint-Honoré, a 10-minute taxi ride or 20-minute walk from the hotel.



RUE DU FAUBOURG SAINT-HONORÉ

Rue du Faubourg Saint-Honoré ranks among the most exclusive shopping streets in the world. Home to a parade of luxury boutiques from both French and international high fashion houses, it's ideal territory for an upmarket shopping expedition. Keep an eye out for famous landmarks as well – the President's residence, Élysée Palace, for instance, is at number 55.

Then, take a 15-minute taxi ride to Le Palais-Royal.



LE PALAIS-ROYAL

8 Rue Montpensier, 75001 Paris

Much like the city itself, the Palais-Royal effortlessly mingles the old with the new; today, the 17th century palace features modern architectural flourishes and art installations within its tranquil grounds. Only a short walk from the Louvre, the landmark's vast gardens and courtyards are well suited to idyllic afternoon strolls.

The next stop is Angelina, 10 minutes' walk from Le Palais-Royal.

This grand dame of a tearoom, located on the equally grand Rue de Rivoli, is another popular Paris destination. Flocks of sweet-toothed patrons descend on this Belle Époque landmark daily to sample its enticing array of pastries and sweets. Most popular of all is the signature Chocolat Chaud L'Africain, a hot chocolate so rich that you might need a spoon to finish it.

Then, walk next door to Librairie Galvani.



LIBRAIRIE GALIGNANI

The very first English-language bookshop in continental Europe, the Librairie Galignani has been a Paris institution since its founding in 1801. Well-known to bibliophiles worldwide, this shop is a standout for its intimate ambiance, chic location on the Rue de Rivoli, wide selection of titles and unique history.

The final stop of the day, La Comédie Française, is 10 minutes' walk from the bookshop.



LA COMÉDIE FRANÇAISE

Founded during the reign of Louis XIV in 1680, La Comédie Française is the only state theatre to possess its own troupe of actors. The theatre company has gone from strength to strength since its creation, and today boasts an enormous repertoire of nearly 3,000 plays from across the centuries.

The hotel is then 10 minutes' walk from La Comédie Française.
