One day itinerary: **Nearby**

A sprawling metropolis of historic sites and cultural attractions, Rome is one of the most-visited cities in the world for a reason. From ancient architecture and Roman ruins to luxurious shopping and nightlife venues, many of the best places to visit in Rome are within easy reach for guests of Hotel Eden. When in Rome, do as the Romans do with this one-day itinerary of nearby sights.

Begin the day with a 10-minute walk to the Spanish Steps.



SPANISH STEPS

Piazza di Spagna, 00187 Rome

Start a tour of Rome with a trip to one of the city's most famous sights: the Spanish Steps. Connecting Piazza di Spagna with Piazza Trinità dei Monti, these 135 steps are a popular meeting place for locals and visitors alike. Grab a coffee from one of the nearby cafés and take a seat on the steps to watch the world go by.

Then, take a one-minute walk across Piazza di Spagna to Via Condotti.



VIA CONDOTTI

Via Condotti is the luxury shopping heart of Rome. The glamorous street is lined with designer boutiques showcasing high-end fashion and accessories that are guaranteed to give your wardrobe a serious face-lift, Italian style. It's the place to go to discover Italian fashion labels such as Valentino, Prada, Dolce & Gabbana and Giorgio Armani.

Next, take a 10-minute walk to the Trevi Fountain.



TREVI FOUNTAIN

Piazza di Trevi, 00187 Rome

While Rome is home to over 2,000 fountains, the Trevi Fountain is arguably the most recognisable. It's widely considered a place of good fortune and people come from near and far to throw coins into the water for good luck. Designed by Nicola Salvi and completed Pietro Bracci in the mid-18th century, the fountain features an imposing statue of Neptune, God of the sea, riding a shell chariot pulled by sea horses.

Follow this with a 10-minute walk to the Mercati di Traiano.



MERCATI DI TRAIANO

The Mercati di Traiano (or Trajan's Markets) are the ruins of a Roman multi-level shopping complex. Set into the side of Quirinal Hill, the semi-circular forum was where Romans would gather to shop, socialise and conduct business. Gaze at the impressive façade and take a walk through the intriguing structure for a fascinating insight into ancient Roman life.

Reach the final destination with a 15-minute walk.



GREGORY'S JAZZ CLUB

Relax after a busy day of sightseeing at Gregory's Jazz Club, a whisky bar and live music venue located close to the hotel. An excellent place for music enthusiasts, the club hosts performances by live jazz musicians and ensembles. Enjoy fine dining in the on-site restaurant before making the most of the well-stocked bar, which offers around 150 premium whiskeys from around the world.

At the end of the evening, take a five-minute walk back to the hotel.
